Senior Parking Issue Resolved

Senior parking has been an issue recently at Colebrook Academy, with questions ranging from how many students can park at the school to how students leave the lot after school. Part of the policy requires that the seniors must wait to leave the parking lot after the buses have passed, which has never been a problem. After waiting for the buses to leave, students would turn left out of the parking lot, and proceed to Pleasant Street.
