Juniors, Seniors Prepare For Fall SATs

On Saturday, November 4, some CA juniors and seniors will report to Canaan Memorial High School to take the Scholastic Assessment Test, more commonly known as the SATs. Any junior or senior can take the test, which costs approximately \$52.50.

The SATs are most commonly used for college admissions in the U.S. and although taking the SAT can be an important part of applying to colleges, they are not always required for admission. The purpose of SAT is to measure how ready students are for college and to attempt to gauge how successful their futures will be.

Results typically take two to three weeks, and will show how prepared students are in the areas that were tested.

Juniors and seniors who are taking the SAT may want to be studying and practicing for the test since it will be taking place on November 4. Anyone taking the test should report to the test center at Canaan Memorial High School before 8 a.m.
